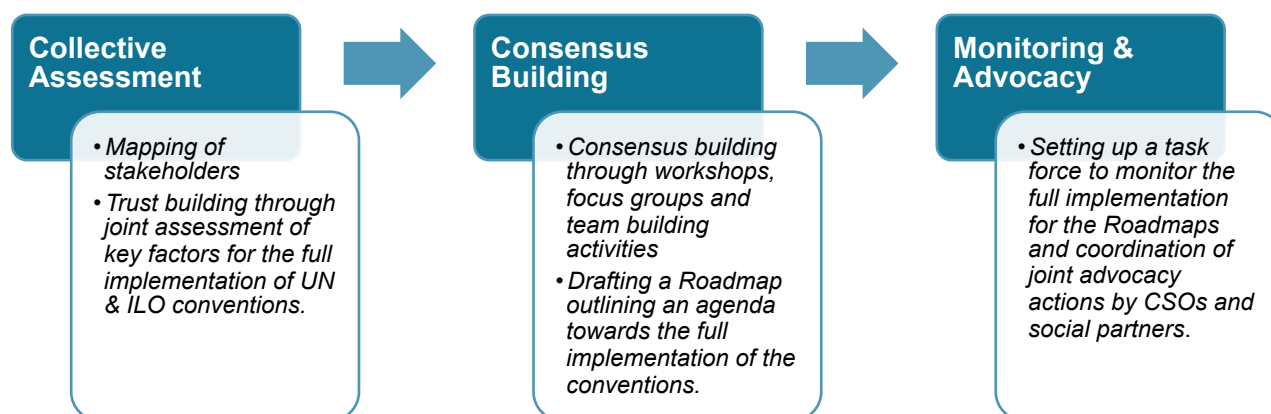


INSPIRED+ is an EU funded project that will support local actors **in nine different countries** in identifying, analysing and monitoring those domestic policies that hinder the full implementation of the UN and ILO conventions relevant to the EU's Generalised Scheme of Preferences Plus (GSP+). The logic of intervention is based on the economic incentives that arise under the GSP+ as it provides a **unique window of opportunity** to open and support spaces for policy dialogue between the government and other key stakeholders (namely civil society organisations (CSOs) and social partners). All nine different locally-led policy dialogues of INSPIRED+ will contribute to the nurturing of trust between all stakeholders, increase capacities of CSOs and social partners in monitoring and advocacy, and lead to the adoption of locally owned Roadmaps outlining an agenda towards the full implementation of the relevant UN and ILO conventions.

Operating model

Following the INSPIRED method, which was developed by EPD and already tested in a variety of contexts, all nine dialogue processes will be structured in the following three phases:

To this end, one **Hosting Structure** will be selected per country, a local actor who will convene and facilitate the policy dialogue process, acting as an impartial and honest 'broker'. The key role of these Hosting Structures will consist of enabling local CSOs, social partners and other relevant actors to play an active role in the identification of the key institutional capacity gaps for the fulfilment of partner country obligations under the UN & ILO conventions.

CdM and **NIMD** will contribute their specific knowledge on results-oriented dialogue and engagement of political leadership and political parties. The consortium will assist the Hosting Structures in the facilitation of the dialogue processes and the monitoring of the resulting roadmaps for the adoption or reform of national policies in line with the selected conventions. **EPD**, along with these partners, will work towards ensuring that these dialogues are inclusive and participatory, that no key stakeholder is left behind and that discussions are informed by actual and reliable evidence.
