% of persons/target population in a given context reporting an improved feeling of safety and dignity by the end of the intervention compared to at the beginning	<p>In the comments field:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1) Safety and dignity to be defined and qualified in each context based on the elements identified in the risk analysis – this could be improved freedom of movement; reduced level of violence; better access to services, livelihoods, etc. This requires a solid baseline around questions best qualifying safety and dignity in that particular context to be established at the start of the intervention, and measured again at the end of the intervention. In order to cope with attribution the people interviewed should also be able to mention at least X [X to be defined at proposal stage] activities of the action that contributed to improve safety and dignity; 2) Provide absolute numbers; 3) Disaggregate numbers by age and sex.
