

## YEE PROJECT END AND HANDOVER EVENT DAR ES SALAAM - 23, AUGUST 2018



#### **BACKGROUND:**

Plan International on behalf of Voluntary Overseas Services (VSO), Vocational Educational training Authority (VETA), Uhamasishaji Hifadhi Kisarawe, Community Development Relief Trust(CODERT) and CCBRT as implementing partners handed over the three - year (2015 - 2018) project; "Partnership to enhance livelihoods and social inclusion of marginalised young people dependent on the informal economy", popularly known as Youth Economic Empowerment (YEE). The project was worth EUR 3,874,980 and implemented in the 10 councils (Temeke, Ilala, Kibaha Town Council, Kibaha District Council, Kisarawe, Ifakara, Lindi Municipality, Lindi district Council, Mtwara District Council and Mtwara Mikindani

Town Council) across Dar es Salaam, Morogoro, Pwani, Lindi and Mtwara regions in Tanzania.

The project reached 10,132 young people aged between 15 – 35years exceeding the projected number of 9,100 of the same age group.

#### **OBJECTIVE OF THE EVENT:**

- Sharing and showcasing project successes
- Handover of the project to the government

#### PROJECT HANDOVER:

The Deputy Minister of State for Parliamentary affairs, Labour, employment, youth and people with disabilities, also the Guest of Honour, Hon. Anthony Mavunde, received the youth project on behalf of the Government of Tanzania.

During his speech, the deputy minister committed that the government, will ensure project results are sustained and youth are supported to ensure the skills acquired are used for the benefit of the nation.

"This is one of the projects that the government has interest in, and therefore we commit to continue supporting the youth and ensure they continue from where the project ended, we cannot stand aloof and see the project results being squandered", said the minister.

Other government officials who attended the events were Regional and district commissioners, District Executive Directors and their relevant staff from implementing councils, EU officials from the Tanzania Delegation office, the media, implementing partners, project beneficiaries, members of the civil society organisations and other stakeholders at different government administrative levels.





"I would like to thank implementing partners and relevant government ministries who made this project realize its objectives. Let us continue working together to ensure realization of Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) and take our country towards achieving vision 2025. Together, let's not leave any child/youth behind", shared the Acting Plan International Deputy Country Director - Programs, Dr Benatus Sambili.



"I have closely worked with project implementers especially in monitoring and officiating various events. Supporting all these youth to be who they are today was not easy. And as local government, will continue working with the youth to ensure that results are cemented" said Dr Steven Kebwe, the Regional commissioner Morogoro.

### THE EVENT:

Young people who benefitted from the project showcased their acquired skills and demonstrated their new entrepreneurial abilities during the event; they were blessed to exhibit their products and skills.

Plan International engaged a consultant to conduct the YEE project evaluation, and during the handover, he presented the report where he revealed that approximately 78% of beneficiaries are now in employment, 68% being self-employed while 10% are in formal employment.

Mkurugenzi Msaidizi wa Plan International, Benatus Sambili alisema mradi huo uliodhaminiwa na EU kwa Euro milioni 3.8 (Sh bilioni 10.2) umevuka lengo la kuwafikia vijana ambapo awali ilikuwa vijana 9,100 lakini wakifikiwa 10,132.

Aliitaja mikoa ambayo mradi huo ulitekelezwa kuwa ni pamoja na Dar

goro, Mtwara na Lindi katika Halmashauri 10. Alisema mbali ya mafunzo hayo pia vijana hao wamewezi kupatiwa zana za kazi na vikundi 884 kuundwa, vikundi vya akiba na mikopo 489 pamos na kuundwa kwa na jukwaa ya vijana kwa ajili ya kuwatetea vij na kubainisha fursa zilizopo.

group.


