Channels for env. policy dialogue

Bilateral: Sub-committees (enlargement and ENP); High Level Dialogues (strategic partners), Trade and Sustainable Development Committees (FTAs), ad-hoc subject specific (CE missions, VCs)

EU Regional: Union for the Mediterranean, Eastern Partnership, Asia Europe Meeting (ASEM)

Multilateral Environmental Agreements, UNEA, Other UN meetings (SDGs/HLPF)

Non-EU: G7 Environment Ministers, ASEAN, African Ministerial Conference on Environment (AMCEN)



Examples

Iran

- Political agreement to work on environment
- Dialogue road map (4 pilots air, waste, water ,soil)
- DEVCO funds for special measures (€8 million for env)
- Implemented through MS agencies
 - EU MS bring own bilateral projects we lever funding

Other countries

- Similar set up considered for Brazil (water)
- Similar set ups for China Europe Water Platform and EU-India Water Partnership with strong MS involvement.



What makes a dialogue attractive?

- Interest for both partners
- Money! (can steer towards EU priorities)
- Exchanges of expertise/know-how/experience.
- Taking environment out of its box -links to livelihoods, health, job creation
 - Circular economy creating jobs/SMEs
- Helping countries to implement their international commitments
 - MEAs/SDGs
 - Improving international image



Lessons

- No pro-active follow-up quickly leads to no interest!
- Environment is a low hanging fruit
 - Citizens are interested (i.e. health) politicians follow
 - Mainstreaming is easy, cheap and common sense
 - Environmental benefits becoming quantifiable
 - Env actions visible -raise the profile of the EU/media attention
- We need to improve collaboration with EU MS bilateral programmes as project money reduces.
- Environmental profiles were useful as references for dialogue
- We can't have formal dialogue with all countries so we rely on delegations!
