The Chair asked SCM to discuss matters arising from the First Summary Report.

Tor Item 9: COMPOSITION OF THE STEERING COMMITTEE  Mr De La Maza made the comment, that the composition of the Steering Committee as well as the Technical Advisory Committee (TAC) should be more balanced in terms of Institutional participation from Dominican Republic (DR). He requested to also include the National Energy Commission / Comisión Nacional de Energía (CNE) as SC and TAC member. The reason is, that CNE has a very important role regarding renewable energy (RE) implementation and the national RE goals in DR. Mr Pierantoni asked about the detailed role of CNE and Mr De La Maza explained, that CNE is attached to the Ministry of Energy and Mining (MEM) but currently still an autonomous public institution. Based on the National Pact to handle the Dominican Republic's energy sector, NEC would be absorbed by MEM in the future. He also referred to official correspondence from MEM to CARICOM/CARIFORUM from 27 November 2017, in which MEM nominates and requests CNE as additional SCM. Unfortunately, the letter never arrived at the CARIFORUM Directorate and, thus, Mr Marie invited MEM DR to send the letter again. He made also the point, that only 3 Country Representatives are Members of the TAPSEC SC. These are St. Kitts and Nevis in its current role as Chair of CARIFORUM, Trinidad and Tobago serving as lead on Energy in CARIFORUM and the Dominican Republic to bring regional and geographical balance to the SC. It was suggested, that the role of CNE in TAPSEC will be further discussed under Agenda Item 7. Mr Marie and Mr Pierantoni highlighted, that the SC should be kept as tight as possible.  It was discussed and agreed, that Trinidad and Tobago (Ms Hankey) sends an official letter to CARIFORUM Directorate, nominating her along with an alternative representative for the TAPSEC SC.  It was agreed in the first SC-Meeting, to establish a document storage system for SCM's use. The CARICOM system doesn't allow external usage. Regional Energy Modelling Workshop Dr. Gardner provided input about the high relevance for Energy Modelling and the hosting of a regional kick-off workshop, which has been proposed by CARICOM for 27 - 28 June, 2018 in Trinidad and Tobago. Instead of hiring international short-term consultants for detailed grid assessments and further energy modelling, existing regional expertise should be used and further developed. Currently, the main existing regional energy modelling experiences lies at UWI, particularly with their Ph.D. Students. After a discussion between SCM, the preparation of the workshop has been endorsed.	<b>Decision:</b> The preparation of the Regional Energy Modelling Workshop, planned for 27 – 28 June, 2018 has been endorsed. Regional Regulatory Forum  Dr. Gardner explained the history about the planned Regional Regulatory Forum and highlighted its necessity, particularly with regards to TAPSEC as this a key working area. The idea is, to integrate the workshop/topic in the next Caribbean Sustainable Energy Forum (C-SEF), which is planned for 19 - 20 November, 2018 in Belize. After a short discussion between SCM, it was mentioned by Mr Khan, that the dates for the intended workshop are probably in conflict with other regional and international events, in which the regulators might have to participate.	Decision: The preparation of a Regional Regulatory Forum has been endorsed in principal. An investigation regarding proposed dates to avoid conflicts with other events is required. <ul> <li>Mr Zellner gave an overview of the TAPSEC staff concept and informed SCM about the current staffing situation (references are made to Annex III, Slide 17):</li> <li>The position of the Programme Leader is currently advertised and will be filled ASAP. In the meanwhile, Mr Simon Zellner is the main contact person and responsible together with Ms Marina Meuss.</li> <li>The position for No. 10 Project Finance Management, Reporting (Finance Manager) has been filled by Julia Krauss (100% TAPSEC), with a focus on internal finance management, book keeping and accounting between GIZ and the EU. Ms Krauss will be based in the GIZ regional office in Santo Domingo, Dominican Republic and starts her assignment on 04 April, 2018.</li> <li>As first regional consultant, the position No 8. Communication (PR) will be filled shortly. GIZ is just about to publish the job advert.</li> <li>Once the TAPSEC activities and related relevant experts' profiles are clearer, GIZ will immediately continue the recruitment of further outlined positions from the staffing chart.</li> </ul>		-

Mr Zellner also raised the question about the status of CCREEE as main beneficiary of TAPSEC. This is particularly relevant, as 2 regional GIZ experts are going to be based at the CCREEE office, including Communication/PR. Dr. Gardner provided an update of the legal status of CCREEE. 13 CARICOM Member States have signed the legal status agreement for CCREEE. This has to be ratified by another 5 Member States. So far, 4 countries ratified the legal status agreement, incl. Belize. Once 5 Countries ratified, CCREEE can become officially operational in Barbados. Dr. Gardner also informed SCM, that the recruitment for the Executive Director, a Senior Secretary and a Sustainable Energy Expert started.	RECOMMENDATIONS
