SDG 10 - Reduce inequality within and among countries EU RF statement - Step up efforts to mitigate the impact of forced displacement and to promote the better management of migration in partners countries in all its aspects
3. Technical Definition
<p>This indicator refers to the number of strategies or policies in the field of migration management and/or forced displacement developed/ revised or under implementation with the EU support.</p> <p>Regional, national or sub-national strategies, policies, frameworks, memoranda, development plans, agreements, etc may be included.</p> <p>Examples of migration management/forced displacement strategy/policy areas include border management, labour and facilitated migration, assisted voluntary return, assistance for vulnerable migrants/displaced persons, socio-economic inclusion of migrants/forced displaced person, etc.</p> <p>Developed/ revised strategies or policies are those endorsed by the authorities relevant to the local context. Under implementation is taken to mean cases where EU resources support all or part of the implementation.</p> <p>Strategies a) developed/ revised and b) under implementation should be reported separately. The same strategy/policy can be reported against both a) and b) if EU support is provided both at development/ revision and then later at implementation stage as per above definition.</p>
4. Rationale (including policy priorities and links to this indicator)
<p>The New Consensus for Development highlights the positive contribution that well-managed migration and mobility can make to inclusive growth and sustainable development. Nevertheless, migration has become a pressing issue for both developing and developed countries. In some situations, migrant populations are being denied human rights and access to health and education, and risk becoming victims of forced labour and human trafficking. The EU and its Member States recognize that strengthened engagement will help to facilitate the safe, orderly, regular and responsible migration and mobility of people, including through the implementation of planned and well-managed migration policies (SDG 10.7).</p> <p>The communication Lives in Dignity from April 2016 sets out a coherent and holistic, development-led approach to forced displacement. It outlines the need to engage from the outset of a forced displacement crisis with political, developmental and humanitarian instruments and to boost the resilience and self-reliance of forcibly displaced persons and their host communities in an integrated</p>

manner.

In the framework of a regional intervention on migration and forced displacement, 6 countries are supported to revise and develop their national policies and strategies. A migration policy is developed in country 1 and 2 (one per country); a forced displacement strategy is revised in country 3 and 4 (one per country); a comprehensive migration and forced displacement policy is under implementation in country 5; a draft plan for migration management is discussed in country 6. a) The number of migration management or forced displacement strategies or policies developed/ revised is 4 as the draft in discussions should not be taken into account. b) The number of migration management or forced displacement strategies or policies under implementation is 1
